

Unmet Need for Chronic Care Among Residents in Missouri

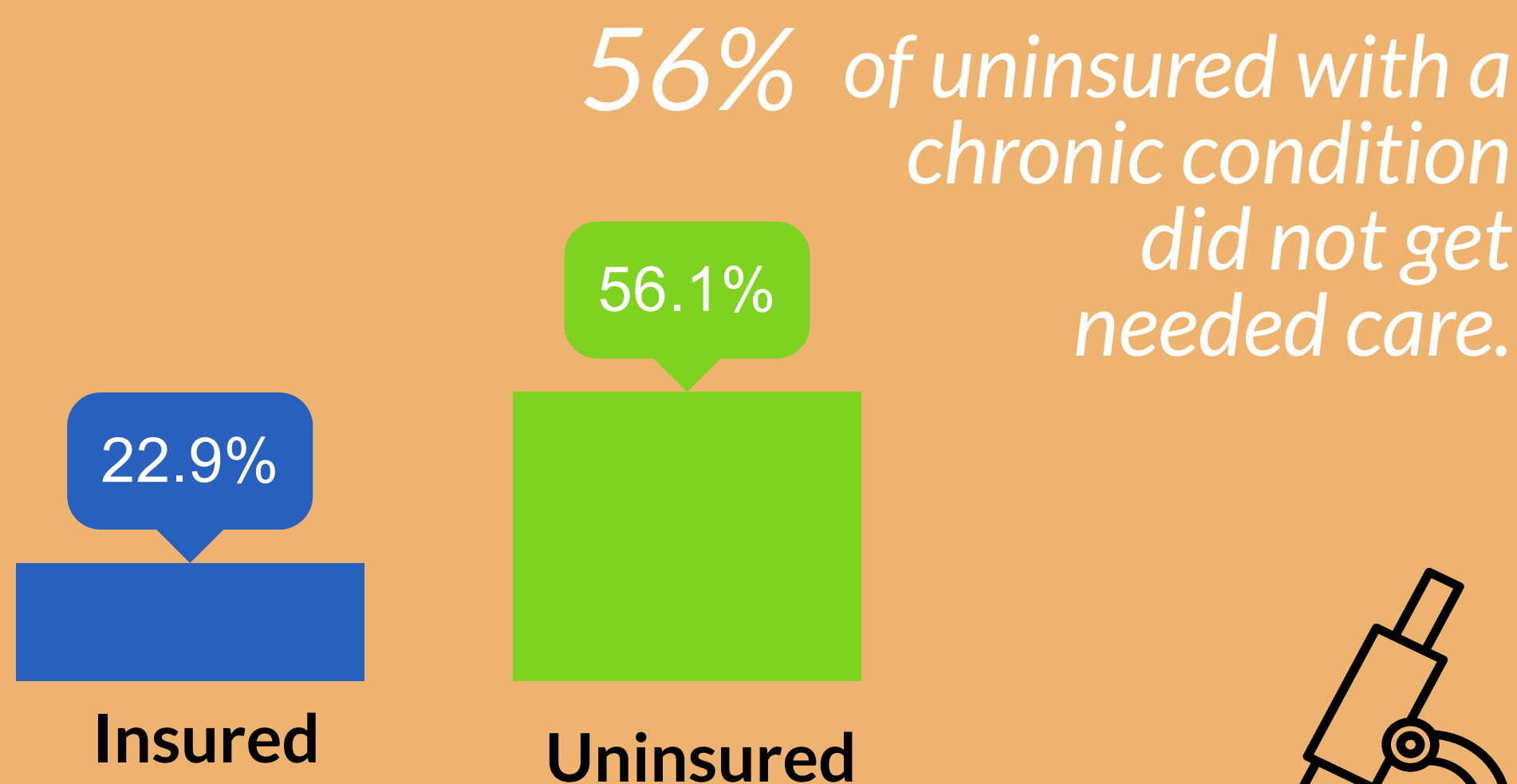
Results from the 2017 Kansas and Missouri Consumer Health Access Survey (KMHS)

60% of adults ages 19-64 reported a diagnosed chronic condition.

28% with chronic conditions did not get needed care in the past year.

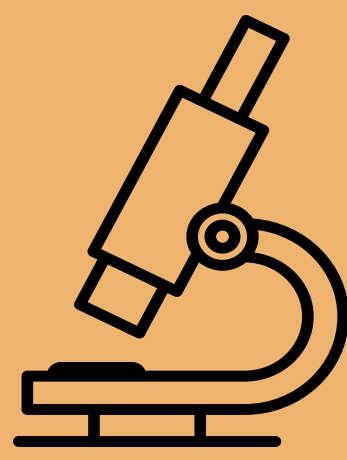


Percent reporting unmet need



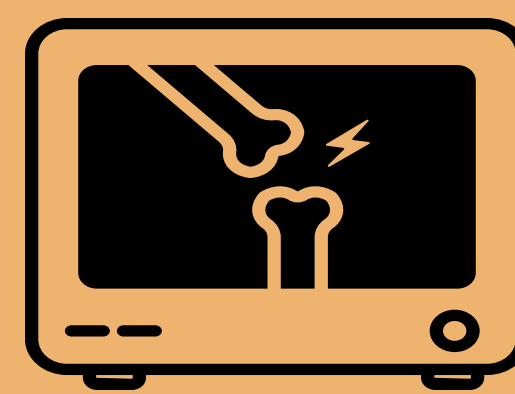
56% of uninsured with a chronic condition did not get needed care.

Respondents with a diagnosed chronic condition

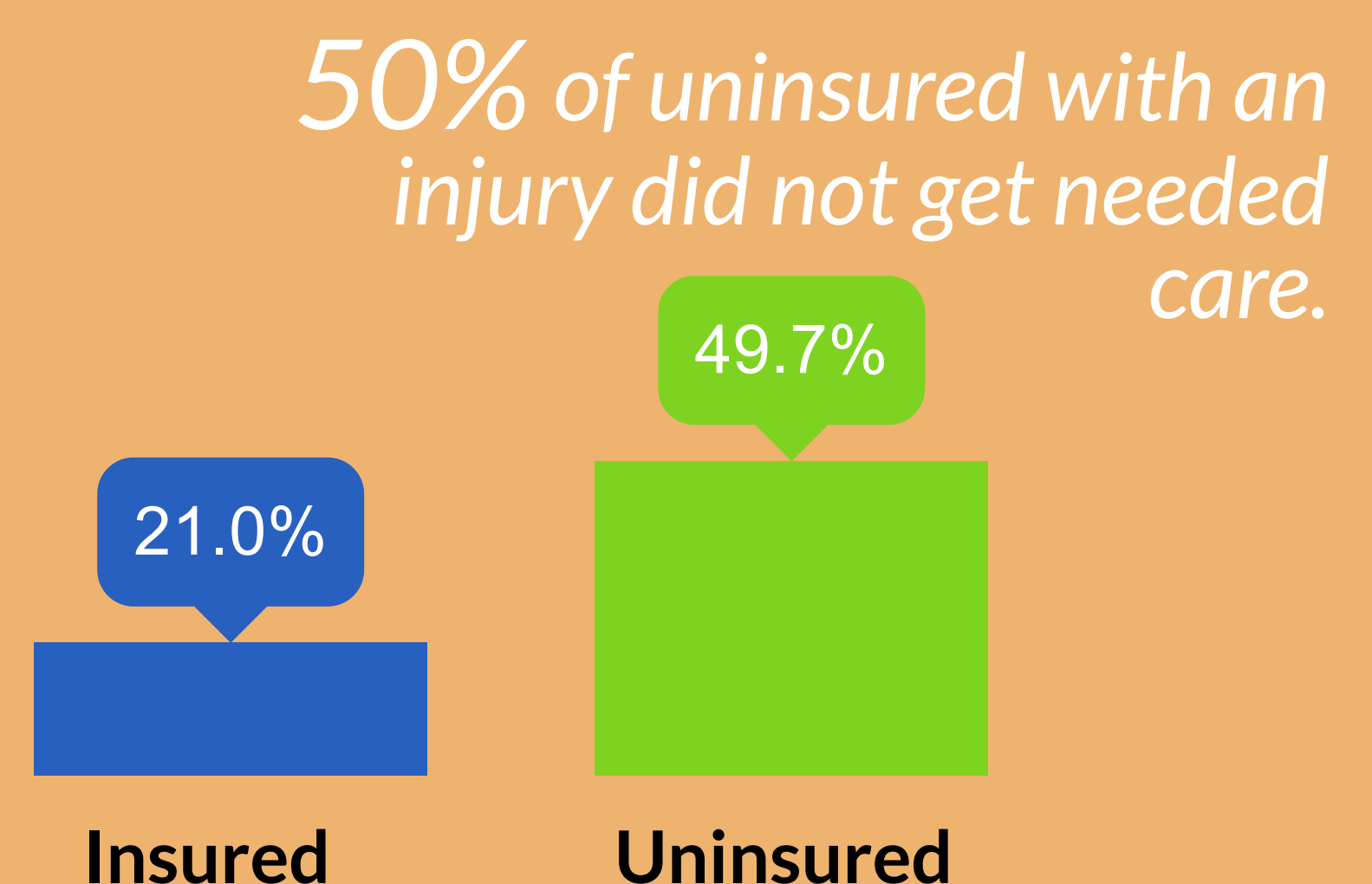


12% of adults ages 19-64 reported an injury that impacts work.*

29% with an injury did not get needed care.



Percent reporting unmet need



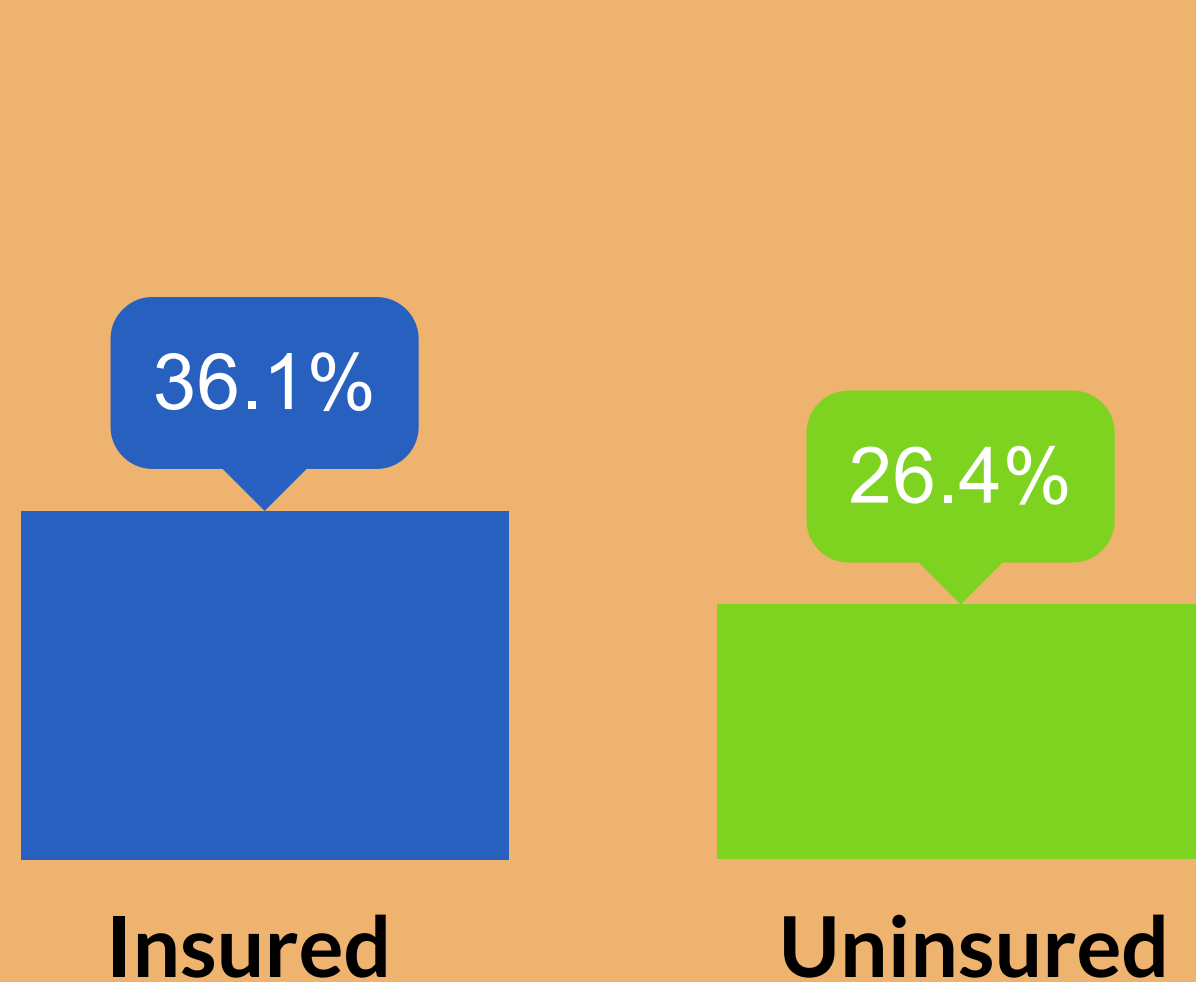
50% of uninsured with an injury did not get needed care.

* Reported an injury that prevents working at a job or working as many hours as respondent would like.

30% of adults ages 19-64 reported a mental health diagnosis, substance abuse or addiction.

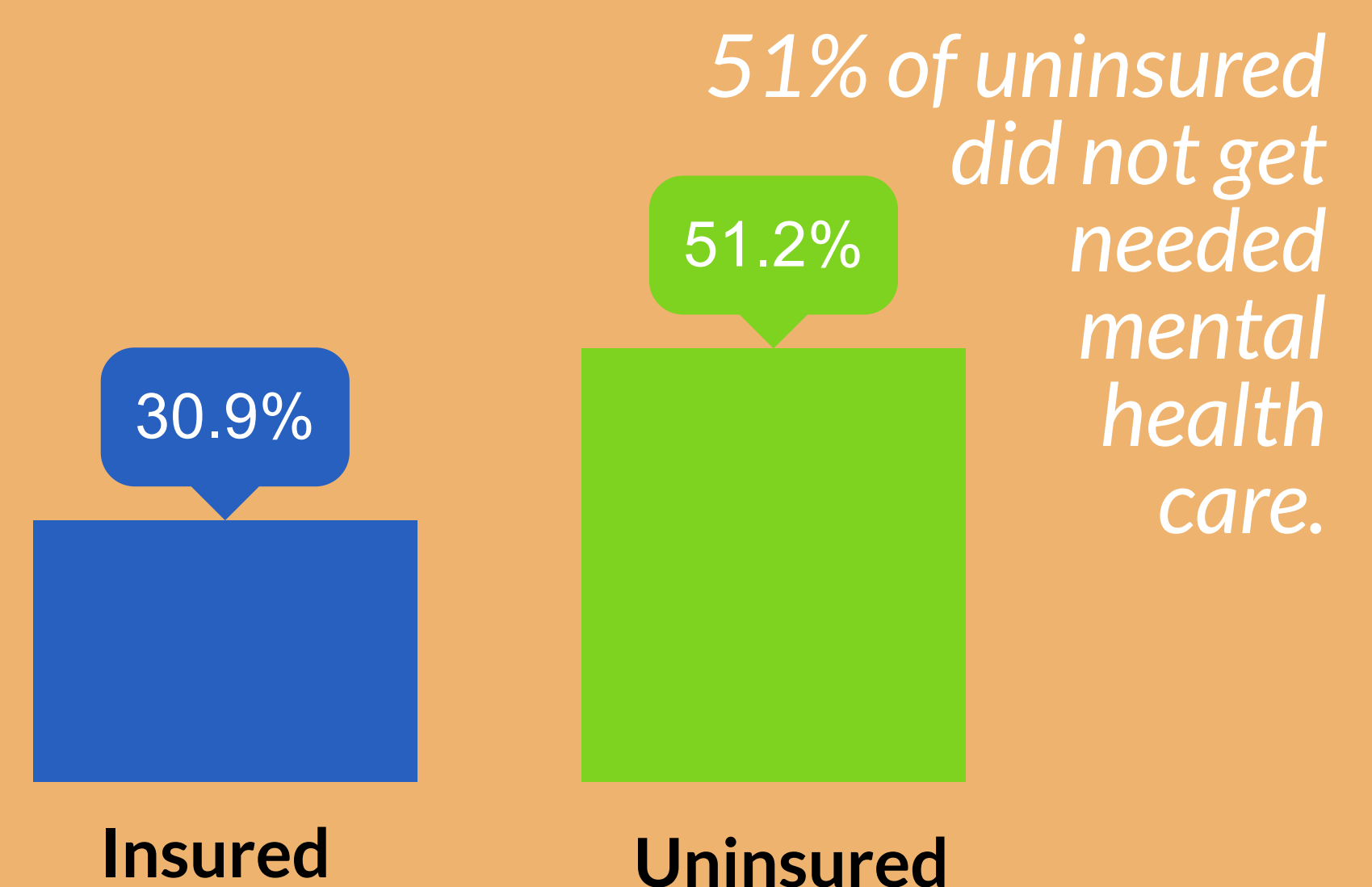
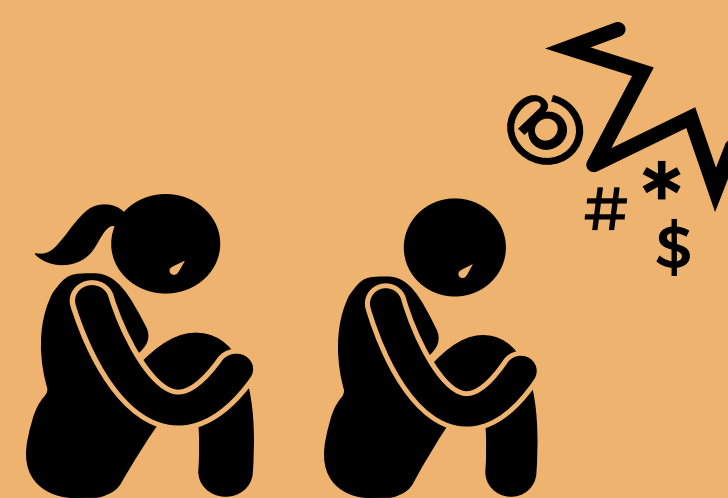
34% saw a mental health professional in the past year*.

35% did not get needed mental health care or counseling.

51% of uninsured did not get needed mental health care.

* There was no statistically significant difference in this percentage by insurance status.
